



BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS OF MIGRANTS

1. Everyone has the right to liberty and security of person. No one shall be subjected to arbitrary arrest or detention. (ICCPR 9.1, UDHR 3 and 9, CAT 9, ECHR 5.1, EU Charter 6)
2. Everyone has the right to seek and to enjoy in other countries asylum from persecution. (UDHR 14, EU Charter 18)
3. Everyone has the right to a nationality. (UDHR 15.1, ICCPR 24.3)
4. Everyone lawfully within the territory of a State shall, within that territory, have the right to liberty of movement and freedom to choose his residence. (ICCPR 12.1, UDHR 13.1, Ref 26, EU Charter 45.1)
5. Everyone has the right to leave any country, including his own, and to return to his country. (ICCPR 12.2, UDHR 13.2)
6. Everyone has the right to be protected from expulsion, return ('refoulement') or extradition to a State where his life or freedom would be threatened on account of his race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion. (UDHR 14, Ref 33.1, CAT 3, EU Charter 19.2)
